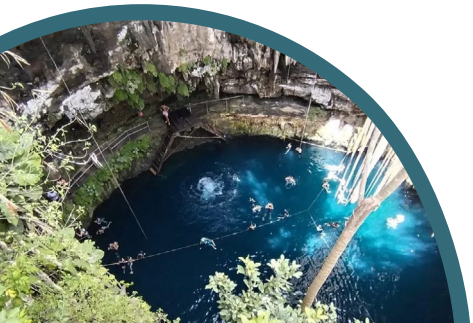

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# | Chichén Itzá archaeological zone



| We will visit Chichén Itzá, which in the Mayan language means (mouth of the well of the water wise men), referring to the Sacred Cenote, the great natural well that the inhabitants of the region considered one of the main entrances to the underworld, seat of important gods, like those of the rain. Furthermore, the name of the site alludes to the Itzaes, powerful mythical-historical lords of the city during the time of its growth and heyday.

Chichén Itzá is one of the main Mayan archaeological sites on the Yucatán Peninsula in Mexico. It consisted of a city or a ceremonial center that went through various construction periods and influences from the different peoples that occupied it and who promoted it since its foundation.

An important and renowned vestige of the Mayan civilization, the main constructions that remain there correspond to the period called late classic or early postclassic (800-1100 AD) within the Mesoamerican Postclassic period. It is considered the seventh wonder of the modern world.





## | Cenote Oxmán



| A beautiful hacienda emerges on the road to Valladolid, it is San Lorenzo Oxmán, which contrasts perfectly with the nature of the place. Its immense gardens offer places where you can take a photo, rest or admire its surroundings.

But its greatest attraction is an immense hole where you can admire a cenote. On its surface it is surrounded by vegetation that invites birds to find a home inside. Other species simply come down to drink water or cool off a little. To access the cenote you must enter through a hole where you will descend spiral-shaped stairs until you come across a large stone hole. Immediately you will be able to admire the beauty of the cenote, all of it is surrounded by vegetation and the tree roots that fall until they touch the water. The song of the birds that flutter and play throughout the place captivates you and you are surprised by the ingenuity they have acquired over the years of living among the holes in the stones. Swimming in the cenote is like diving into the fountain of youth. Ideal to refresh yourself after an experience in Chichen Itza.

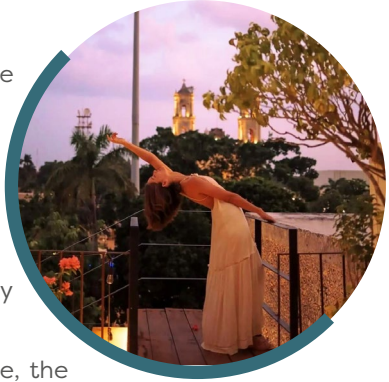
The square is flanked by colonial buildings with arches and has cafes with terraces to rest for a while.
